"Sex Trafficking" is claimed by the US State Department, the UN, and the IOM to be a problem in most countries in the global South, including many in the Caribbean region. Yet there is much confusion at the local government and public levels about how this claim is arrived at, even while various initiatives are being taken to address the problem. Professor Kempadoo will address the issue of sex trafficking in the Caribbean today, examining it in the contexts of the local sex trade and the global politics of the war on human trafficking.
